ORAL HISTORY INTERVIEWS

- Isabel Melendez, 1988. (Accession № 2007.500.357, Old № 143) — Excellent oral history by Isabel Melendez, working at the time at Greater Lawrence Community Action Council, well-known as a founder of *Semana Hispana*. She speaks about: immigration from Puerto Rico in 1959; migration from New York and kinship; working at Lawrence Maid Shoes, Gerber Shoes, and Jo Gal, and working conditions; language barrier; opening first Hispanic social club in 1964; opening her own business in 1970; noticing multiple Hispanic cultures in Lawrence by 1973; and working at GLCAC.
- Carolina DeJesus, 1995. (Accession № 2007.500.139, Old № 361) — Single mother in young parents program. *Interviewer*: "...Why did you move back to Lawrence just before your twins were born?" / Carolina: "I moved to Lawrence because New York is, I don't consider a nice place for a child to be raised in. You know. I was thinking about my kids to be raised in a nice city, not gangs, stuff like that, bad things. I didn't want that. I had to make the right choice."
- Julia Silverio, 2002. (Accession № 2007.500.488, Old Nos 550–551) — Excellent interview of Dominican immigrant and entrepreneur, Lawrence City Councilor, and owner of Julia's Travel and Consulting as well as an insurance agency. She speaks about: immigration from Dominican Republic and political unrest there; parents worked in Lawrence mills; in 1970s as a child, racial issues in Lawrence were noticeable along with arson; she worked at Lawrence Maid; founding her business, Julia's Consulting Agency; entering political life in Lawrence; and 1980s founding of the Soc-ial Sports Club (Los Trinitarios), one of the oldest Dominican clubs in Lawrence.
- Daniel Rivera, 2003. (Accession № 2007.500.445, Old № 590) — Interview of Daniel Rivera (who later became Mayor), who speaks about his wartime experience in Saudi Arabia (he begins by explaining how he was born in the Bronx, came to Lawrence because mother was a seamstress, and graduated Lawrence High School, after which he enlisted in the US Army).
- Marta Montes-Rentas, 2005. (Accession № 2007.500.439, Old № 632) — Narrator speaks about: birth in Puerto Rico, migration to NYC followed by migration to Lawrence in 1989; language barrier; preservation of Puerto Rican culture in Lawrence.
- Francisco Ureña, 2007. (Accession № 2007.500.578, Old Nos 679–680) — Former City and State Veterans' Services official. Speaks to his service in the US Marines for Operation Iraqi Freedom (begins tape 679 by explaining how he was raised in Lawrence, mother worked in factories, ends tape 680 mentioning work for *Rumbo* and the Veterans' Services office).
- Ralph Carrero, 2008. (Accession № 2007.500.616, Old № 717) — First Hispanic elected official in Lawrence (School Committee member, starting 1991), as well as founding president of the Lawrence Family Development Charter School, etc. He speaks about: family's immigration to NYC; uncle convinced family to move to Lawrence for work in mills, 1967; schooling in Lawrence; career in education and criminal justice; Lawrence Family Development Charter School; involvement in Lawrence politics.
- Manuela Su, 2009. (Accession № 2007.500.618, Old № 754) — Cuban immigrant, came to Lawrence after taking a Freedom Flight; graduate of Lawrence High School; parents worked at Lawrence Maid Shoes; coordinator of bilingual training; Los Amigos center for child care.
- Misael Martinez, 2009. (Accession № 2007.500.625, Old № 755) — Family and adolescent counselor, born in NYC; family moved to Lawrence, and went to Lawrence schools; Movement City and Hope Street; Parent Education Leader for Lawrence schools.

“Lawrence Revives—Part Way”, pp. 61–62 in *Business Week*, 10 Jun. 1950. Photocopy only. (Lawrence: Economic Transition subject box) — One-year follow up article (see above). Statistics.

“New England’s New Look”, pp. 131–132 in *Fortune*, Oct. 1953. (Accession № 2000.000.002, Library) — Commentary on economic decline in Lawrence and New England generally. One photo of a repurposed mill in Lawrence.

“The Twilight of American Woolen”, pp. 92–96, 198–204, in *Fortune*, Mar. 1954. Photocopy only. (Lawrence: Economic Transition subject box) — Explains the decline of American Woolen Co. in Lawrence.

“The Nation Applauds... Industry Endorses... ‘Operation Bootstrap’ in Greater Lawrence”, p. A13 in the *Eagle-Tribune*, 8-9 Apr. 1958. (Lawrence: Economic Transition subject box) — Full-page ad by the Greater Lawrence Citizens Committee for Industrial Development about Lawrence’s purported economic recovery. With photo. Lawrence officials’ views of the economic situation.

“Chapter III: Economic Change in a Depressed Area”, in dissertation, *A Study of the Secondary Effects of Structural Change in the Textile Industry of Lawrence, Mass.*, by James Melton Howell, Tulane University, 1963. Photocopy only. (Lawrence: Economic Transition subject box) — Speaks to Lawrence’s economic decline.

“20th Century Decline”, section of “Lawrence, Massachusetts: The Importance of Playing to and Reinventing Uses for Economic Assets”, student paper by John Yang-Sammataro, Fall 2009. (Accession № 2010.013.001, Lawrence: Economic Transition subject box) — Uses oral history interviews to paint broad picture of economic decline in Lawrence.

b. Recruitment of Latino workers. *Had difficulty finding resources which directly speak to “recruitment” of Latino workers by “certain declining industries”. However, one source speaks to manufacturing as a secondary area of employment after farm work:*

“II. Origins and Arrivals” in *Growing Up Hispanic in Lawrence, Massachusetts*, by the Urban Studies Institute, Oct. 1986. (Accession № 1986.123.001, Hispanic Studies and Reports - 1 subject box) — “The first [Puerto Rican Americans] to come to the Merrimack Valley were seasonal farm workers, arriving in the late 1950’s to harvest apples and other crops. Some liked Lawrence, found manufacturing jobs here, and stayed.” p.7

c. Flight of residents, manufacturing, and retail to suburbs.

“Textile Towns of New England Now Lose Wool Mills to South”, pp. 76, 78 in *Newsweek*, 3 Mar. 1952. Photocopy only. (Lawrence: Economic Transition subject box) — About American Woolen Co. moving out of Lawrence, and New England. Photos, and infographic “Textile Trend: Cotton Mills Desert New England”.

Build On Lawrence, Jan. 1980, published by City of Lawrence (Community Development Department). (Accession № 1998.079.035, Lawrence: Economic Transition subject box, Strategy For The Future folder) — Introduction speaks to the disappearance of the downtown Intown neighborhood, economic decline, and suburbia.

d. Economic impacts of deindustrialization and suburbanization.

Implications of a Changing Economic Base in Lawrence, Mass., Thomas O'Leary, Jr., Jan. 1974. (Accession № 2020.008, Lawrence: Economic Transition subject box) — O'Leary was the County Planner of Essex County. 40 page report. See chapters "New Decades of Despair: 1920–1950" and "Restructuring the Economic Base: 1950–1970".

"Suburbs share blame for 'cesspool' image", letter to the editor by Beth Ann Vaitkunas Patterson in the *Eagle-Tribune* (no date, probably during last week of June 1987). (Americanization, Naturalization, and The Flag subject box, Misc. Clippings folder) — Writer, of Lithuanian descent, asks: "How many of the people who complain about Lawrence have ancestors who came from this city or from another city like it? How many of our more affluent neighbors inherited their homes from parents or grandparents who seated in the Lawrence mills? How many of your forebears spoke English? Many of mine didn't."

2. The history of im/migration from Latin America to the stateside US.

b. Role of US intervention in Latin America, "harvest of empire".

"II. Origins and Arrivals" in *Growing Up Hispanic in Lawrence, Massachusetts*, by the Urban Studies Institute, Oct. 1986. (Accession № 1986.123.001, Hispanic Studies and Reports - 1 subject box) — Speaks to Spanish Empire, American colonization in Puerto Rico, Dominican Republic politics, etc.

"Lawrence leader has roots in Chile: Seeks truth behind violence", by Mary Fitzgerald (in the *Eagle-Tribune*, 14 Apr. 1987) (Hispanic – By Nationality subject box, Chilean folder) — Mentions frustration with U.S. intervention—about Guilmo Barrio.

Invitations and Programs to "Dia de La Raza" Celebrations, 1997–1999 and 2001, held by United Peruvian Association of the Merrimack Valley (El Asociacion Peruanos Unidos) (Accession N°s 1998.096.070, 1999.051.029, and 1999.079.031 in Hispanic – By Nationality subject box, Peruvian folder) — Invitations to Columbus Day celebrations, as celebrated in Lawrence by Hispanic people. Includes illustration of Columbus and a ship, on front covers. Serves as a representation of how some view Columbus and the arrival of the Spanish Empire.

Program book for Movimiento Puertorriqueño Centro Para Desarrollo, Inc. Celebra El Descubrimiento de Puerto Rico, held 21 Nov. 1997 at Lawrence Public Library. (Accession № 1998.096.19, in Hispanic – By Nationality subject box, Puerto Rican folder) — Program book for event celebrating the discovery of Puerto Rico by Spanish Empire colonizers. Illustration of ship on cover. (Condition note: Has writing in pencil on cover, which could impact display value.)

"First Cuban Airlift Refugee in Lawrence", in *Eagle-Tribune* (21 Dec. 1965), (Hispanic – By Nationality subject box, Cuban folder) — About Mrs. Aracelis (Gonzalez) Delgado.

"Escape!" by Albert D. Manchester in *Yankee Magazine*, May 1968, pp. 72-73 and 104-107. (Accession № 1979.002.03, in Hispanic – By Nationality subject box, Cuban folder) — About four Lawrence residents who escaped from Cuba.

The Challenge to Democracy in Central America released by the U.S. Department of State and Department of Defense, June 1986. 78 pages. (Hispanic – General subject box, Miscellaneous folder) — About communism in Central America and U.S. opposition/intervention during Reagan presidency.

“They fled bombs, death squads; say Washington partly to blame: Salvadorans not welcome here or home” by Kathy Brown in the *Eagle-Tribune*, 14 Sept. 1985 (Hispanic – By Nationality subject box, Salvadoran folder) — Local Salvadoran refugees’ perspectives.

- c. **Migration from Puerto Rico and from the Dominican Republic.** *I had difficulty finding resources which directly speak to migration from Puerto Rico and the Dominican Republic, with the exception of the following.*

“II. Origins and Arrivals” in *Growing Up Hispanic in Lawrence, Massachusetts*, by the Urban Studies Institute, Oct. 1986. (Accession № 1986.123.001, Hispanic Studies and Reports - 1 subject box).

- d. **Obstacles to legal immigration.**

“U.S. Citizenship Preparation Program”/“Preparacion Para La Ciudadania Estado Unidense”, Northern Essex Community College, 1989. (Americanization, Naturalization, and The Flag subject box, Misc. Clippings folder) — Bilingual flyer advertising citizenship classes. Has example of legalese used in reference to naturalization and amnesty, mentions I-688 Card.

“As Rules Change, More Grandmothers Become Citizens” by Anita Perkins in the *Eagle-Tribune* (23 Jan. 1995). (Americanization, Naturalization, and The Flag subject box, Misc. Clippings folder) — Story of Digna Celado, 60-year-old who “has taken the citizenship test three times since she moved here from the Dominican Republic 24 years ago”. Mentions language barrier, group of “women over 50 struggling to become U.S. citizens”, and the International Institute.

“Employers Cope With New Law: Immigration Paperwork Burdens Area Companies” by M. Brenda Smith in the *Eagle-Tribune* (7 Jun. 1987). (Americanization, Naturalization, and The Flag subject box, Misc. Clippings folder) — Speaks to Immigration and Naturalization Services policies and laws, how it affects people and corporations locally. Also has photo of Malden Mills workers, working with thread spools which will be used in weaving.

“New Immigration Law Trips Up Teen Workers” by Michael Foley in the *Eagle-Tribune* (31 Mar. 1989) (Americanization, Naturalization, and The Flag subject box, Misc. Clippings folder) — “...parents [...] are shocked their teenagers cannot get part-time jobs without proof they were born here. [...] It can take weeks or months to get the proper photo identification and birth certificate now required when applying for any job, he said.”

“New immigration law has Lawrence aliens worried” in the *Eagle-Tribune* (28 Jan. 1987) (Americanization, Naturalization, and The Flag subject box, Misc. Clippings folder) — Speaks directly to Lawrence immigrants, and institutions facilitating naturalization.

Clippings folder) — About the Immigration and Naturalization Service collaborating with Lawrence Police and Lawrence Housing Authority to detain “suspected illegal aliens” and “working to kick them out of the country”.

“Illegal Aliens Come Out of Hiding, for a Price: Amnesty not for everyone” by Sandy Johnson (AP) in the *Eagle-Tribune* (3 May 1987) (Americanization, Naturalization, and The Flag subject box, Misc. Clippings folder) — Not Lawrence-specific, but speaks to “a combination of opportunity and despair” over the Immigration Reform and Control Act amnesty law. Has photo of warehouse worker inspecting “immigration amnesty forms that will be shipped across the nation”.

“Illegal aliens tiptoe warily out of shadows” in the *Eagle-Tribune* (6 May 1987) (Americanization, Naturalization, and The Flag subject box, Misc. Clippings folder) — Not Lawrence-specific, but shows photo of applicants for U.S. immigration amnesty waiting at the Immigration office in Boston, with bilingual English-Spanish sign.

“Immigrants Fear New Law is Trick to Deport Them” by Barbara Walsh in the *Eagle-Tribune* (6 May 1987) (Americanization, Naturalization, and The Flag subject box, Misc. Clippings folder) — About perceptions of amnesty law in Lawrence.

“New Law Makes Some Hopeful, But Others Hide: Immigrants fear family separations” by Barbara Walsh in the *Eagle-Tribune* (10 May 1987) (Americanization, Naturalization, and The Flag subject box, Misc. Clippings folder) — About the amnesty law’s potential to break up families in Lawrence. Quote from Fr. Robert Guessetto: “The family unit is one of the most important things in Latin American life, and the possibility of the law destroying that is troubling us a great deal.” Important infographic, “Getting amnesty: How aliens can get legal status” specific to immigrants in the Merrimack Valley.

“Otro caso más de brutalidad policial en Lawrence: Oficial golpea a activista comunitaria latina” by Adriana Recchia in *El Planeta* (9–15 Apr. 2010) — About police brutality in Lawrence, specifically against Marisol Rodriguez, a community activist.

1984 Riot subject box — all contents (mostly newspaper clippings), but especially posters announcing curfew (in English, Spanish, and French).

- b. **Challenges due to city’s disinvestment and fiscal crisis.**

Nicolas M. Pernice, *Urban Redevelopment of Lawrence, MA: A Retrospective Case Study of the Plains Neighborhood*, MS in Economic and Social Dev. of Regions thesis, UMass Lowell, 2011. (Accession № 2012.180.001, in Library) — From abstract: “The research presented herein illustrates powerful institutions and local government’s actions toward a vulnerable immigrant community, with an undercurrent of gentrification which lies beneath the goals to revitalize Lawrence, MA. It investigates the clash of differing ideals and perceptions of blight, growth, and what is a desirable community.”

5. Latino activism and community organizing.
